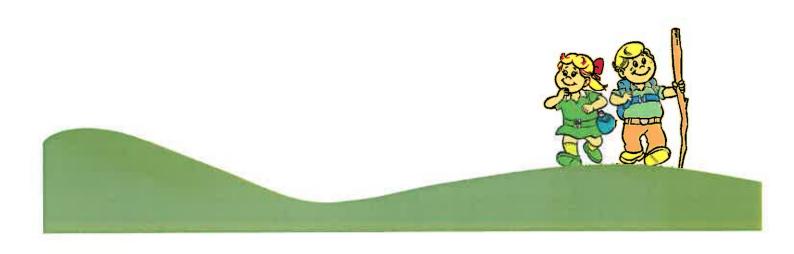

PLEASE REMEMBER LUNCH MONEY IS PAYABLE IN ADVANCE.



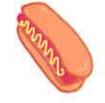
Lunch currently costs £2.30 per day and you can pay a number of weeks in advance if you wish.
